

Staff Packing List

Laundry service is provided 1 time each week. Please make sure you have enough clothing to go through an entire week before washing. Each piece of clothing should be marked with your first and last name in waterproof black marker.

PLAIN WHITE SHIRTS (8) Minimum of 8 - more if you have an active job at camp (e.g. Tennis, Horse riding) or if you perspire a lot. T-shirt, polo shirt, button down, etc. Tops must cover belly and bra straps completely. Spaghetti strap tops and ribbed undershirt tanks are not permitted. Any logos or graphics need to be under 2 square inches in size. Ripped, torn, or cut off clothing is not acceptable uniform and cannot be worn at camp at any time.

NAVY BLUE SHORTS (4-6 pairs) Laundry is done 1x weekly. Minimally you will need 4-6 pairs of shorts. If you have more, you will appreciate the variety! Please no jeans shorts.

LONG PANTS (2-3 pairs) Pants must be navy blue, but NOT JEANS. Most staff will wear navy blue sweatpants or athletic pants. You will need these - it does get cold at night.

WHITE SOCKS (8 pairs) You will need more if you change your socks during the day or if it's rainy.

White shorts (1 pair) You will only need one pair of white shorts or white pants/sweats for Sunday services.

RED T-SHIRT (1) Don't purchase one, but if you have an old one, you should bring it with you for traditional events! If you don't have a red shirt, a red hat, scarf, socks, or any other red clothing item will do.

SWEATSHIRT/FLEECE/SWEATER (2-4) Outer garments worn during camp must always be navy blue without additional logos or insignia. If you get cold easily, we suggest bringing more. We provide you with a warm uniform outer garment at the end of staff orientation, however you should bring at least 1 additional navy blue sweatshirt to keep you warm until then.

RAINCOAT (1) This is a very important item on your packing list. Make sure it's waterproof, not just shower proof (it does not need to be navy blue).

WRISTWATCH (1) **Being on time is very important at camp.** Bugle calls will wake you each morning in time for flag raising, however if you wish to rise earlier, a battery powered alarm will also be helpful.

BATHING SUIT/SWIM SUIT (1-2) All staff will have an opportunity to enjoy the waterfront during the summer. If your activity is at the waterfront, we suggest 2-3. Any color is fine. Suits should be tasteful – no overly revealing or thong swimsuits please.

FLASHLIGHT/HEADLAMP (1) Essential! There is no electricity in the bunks. Batteries can be purchased easily at a local store.

SHOES Sneakers or tennis shoes are the best footwear for camp. Please bring at least two pairs, one that is either waterproof or that you don't mind getting wet. Hiking boots are good for trip day (but not essential). Teva's or other supportive sport sandals may be worn during the camp day, although not for active games and sports or in the craft shops. Flip flops/shower shoes are recommended as well. Platform soled shoes (anything 2 inches or more) may not be worn at camp or at any camp sponsored event due to the high risk of ankle injury. Closed toe shoes are required at campfire.

REGULAR CLOTHES On Sunday evenings for campfire and for your time off, you will need regular clothing. A few outfits (keeping in mind the weather changes) should be enough.

LAUNDRY BAG (1) You will need your own laundry bag in order for your laundry to be done once a week.

INSECT REPELLANT The mosquitoes can be bad at times, especially at the beginning of the summer and in the evenings. If you know of a brand of bug spray at home that suits your skin type, you should bring it along, otherwise it can be easily purchased.

TOILETRIES It may be less expensive for you to stock up on these items before you come to camp, although they can easily be purchased locally once you arrive.

OTHER SUGGESTIONS hat, books, sports equipment, water bottle, camera, crazy creek, garment bag for socks, anything to help teach your activity, games for bunk time, any of these items can be purchased at Wal-mart or a nearby store so if you are traveling, do not feel like you need to pack all of this. Remember your laundry is done for you once a week. Also remember to LABEL everything with your full name.

We are many people living together, and storage space is limited. Please keep this in mind when you are packing for the summer. Also, remember that we provide towels, sheets, blankets, and a pillow.
